COLTS OPEN 2013 REGULAR SEASON AT HOME AGAINST RAIDERS

The Indianapolis Colts will kickoff the 2013 regular season with a home game against the Oakland Raiders at 1 p.m. on Sunday at Lucas Oil Stadium.

The Colts concluded the preseason with a 2-2 record, defeating the New York Giants and Cleveland Browns in Weeks 2 and 3, respectively.

Players such as safety **Delano Howell** and outside linebacker **Caesar Rayford** made the most of their opportunities with their pre-season production and each earned spots on the 53-man active roster. Howell led the team with 21 tackles (13 solo), including 11 in the opening game. Rayford tallied an NFL-high 5.0 sacks in the preseason, which included back-to-back multi-sack performances.

Despite injuries to several starters throughout training camp and the preseason, the team is looking to reach near full strength heading into Week 1. Tight ends **Dwayne Allen** and **Coby Fleener**, running back **Ahmad Bradshaw**, left tackle **Anthony Castonzo** and guard **Mike McGlynn** are all expected back on the field for the season opener.

The Raiders finished their preseason schedule with a 1-3 record. Wide receiver **Brice Butler** led the team in receiving with 108 yards and a touchdown while running back **Rashad Jennings** paced the team on the ground with 31 rushing attempts for 137 yards.

COLTS 30TH ANNIVERSARY

The Indianapolis Colts will celebrate 30 seasons as an NFL franchise in Indianapolis this year. Professional football came to the city on March 28, 1984, when Robert Irsay moved the historic NFL franchise from Baltimore to Indianapolis.



Since moving to Indianapolis, the Colts have compiled a 242-221 (.523) record in 463 total games. During that span, the team has posted one Super Bowl Championship in two appearances, 17 winning seasons, 15 playoff appearances and 12 10-win seasons.

COLTS INJURY UPDATE

COACH PAGANO - MONDAY TRANSCRIPT

Can you give an injury update and how confident you are in having those guys ready for Sunday?

"We had a good portion pretty much out there (Monday). **Anthony Castonzo** is supposed to be ready and rolling by Thursday. Should have him out there by Thursday and should make the game.

Kavell (Conner) is better today than he was. He came in and we initially thought it might be a week or so, but he looked really good today. He didn't practice but he's day-to-day.

(Coby) Fleener practiced.

David Reed, he's still going through the protocol with the concussion. He'll be day-to-day and going through that process. I don't know if there's anybody else that I missed."

Dwayne Allen?

"He was full-go out there today. Looks great. Fresh legs."

Do you expect Ahmad Bradshaw to play this week?

"Yes. There's probably a certain amount of plays we'd like to get him. What that is, I don't know. Again, he was out there and running around and looked pretty good today."

Do you expect Mike McGlynn to be ready to go and to start this game?

"Yes. He was out there today and started today."

GOOD START TO THE SEASON

Over the past 10 years, the Colts have compiled a league-leading .719 winning percentage (23-9) in the month of September. During that span, only seven other teams have posted a winning percentage of at least .600 through the season's first month. The eight total teams have combined to win eight of the 10 Super Bowl championships since 2003.

TWO OF THE BEST

On Sunday, two of the NFL's most experienced kickers will take the field in Adam Vinatieri and Sebastian Janikowski. Combined, the two hold over 30 years of NFL experience, participating in 463 total games. Among active players, Vinatieri leads the league in points scored (1,867, including one two-point conversion in 1998) while Janikowski ranks third (1,389).

COLTS HEAD COACH CHUCK PAGANO



Coaching Years in NFL: 12th Year
Colts Head Coach: 2nd Year
Overall Regular Season: 11-5 (.688)
Overall Postseason: 0-1 (.000)

Chuck Pagano's 2012 season proved to be one of the most inspirational stories in NFL history. Named head coach of the Indianapolis Colts on January 25, 2012, Pagano was forced to take a leave of absence just three games into the season after being diagnosed with acute promyelocytic leukemia, a curable form of the disease, which is a cancer of the blood and bone marrow cells.

Offensive Coordinator Bruce Arians assumed interim head coaching duties and he and the Colts defied the odds and rallied to a 9-3 record. During that time frame, Indianapolis secured a playoff berth and accomplished one of their primary goals – extending the season for Pagano. Some of the victories during Arians' term included a comeback win against Green Bay (Week 5) after trailing by 18 points, an overtime victory on the road at Tennessee (Week 8) and a last second victory in Detroit (Week 13). In all, the Colts posted a 9-1 record in one-possession games in 2012, including winning their last eight.

As much as Chuck Pagano inspired the 2012 Colts, the team did just the same for their ailing head coach. From his hospital bed, Pagano was in constant communication with the coaching staff and players. He analyzed practices while continuing to game-plan schemes. Along the way, Pagano continued to make his presence felt. After the team's Week 9 victory against Miami, the head coach gave a moving post-game speech to the contingent in the locker room.

"I've got circumstances," Pagano told the locker room. "You guys understand it, I understand it. It's already beat (referring to the leukemia). It's already beat. My vision that I'm living is to see two more daughters get married, dance at their weddings and then hoist that Lombardi Trophy several times."

Pagano made another return three weeks later during the team's win against Buffalo where he appeared in Owner & CEO Jim Irsay's suite while saluting the crowd on hand. Pagano received a rousing ovation from Colts fans in attendance.

As the regular season came to an end, the culmination of Arians' stretch as interim head coach concluded with the team's playoff-clinching victory at Kansas City (Week 16). The stage was set for Pagano to return after missing 12 weeks of action.

Division rival Houston visited Lucas Oil Stadium in the regular season finale in hopes of clinching the AFC's No. 1 seed in the playoffs. The Colts were not deterred, however, as the team corralled the emotion in Pagano's return and compiled a 28-16 win to finish the regular season with an 11-5 record. The real victory, however, was the return of a healthy Chuck Pagano. It was a day the Colts organization and fans will remember for generations.

Indianapolis' playoff run ended earlier than the team had wished after falling to the eventual Super Bowl XLVII champion Baltimore Ravens in an AFC Wild Card playoff contest. What was not lost were the numerous team and individual milestones that the Colts established in a season facing low expectations. Most notably, the 11-5 record was a nine-win improvement from the 2011 campaign, which tied for the third-largest one-year turnaround in NFL history. The Colts also registered their 12th 10-plus win season in the past 14 years, which is the most of any NFL team since 1999. Pagano and Arians were honored together by the Maxwell Football Club as the recipients of the 24th Annual Earle "Greasy" Neale Award for Professional Coach of the Year. The two also garnered AFC Coach of the Year honors as winners of the annual NFL 101 Awards. Pagano was selected by the PFWA as the winner of the 2013 George Halas Award, given to an NFL player, coach or staff member who overcame the most adversity to succeed. Each year, the Fritz Pollard Alliance Foundation recognizes individuals who make a difference in diversity and inclusion at an annual awards banquet. In February of 2013, Pagano received the foundation's Game Ball Award for the differences he has made to level the playing field in the NFL for minorities.

RAIDERS HEAD COACH DENNIS ALLEN



Coaching Years in NFL: 12th Year
Raiders Head Coach: 2nd Year

When Dennis Allen became the 18th head coach in Raiders history on Jan. 30, 2012, he promised to field a tough, smart, disciplined and committed football team, noting that organizations win games in the National Football League by more than talent alone.

Allen, 39, is the NFL's youngest head coach, more than six months younger than the league's previously youngest coach, Pittsburgh's Mike Tomlin.

With 16 years of combined coaching experience at the college and professional levels, Allen enters his 11th NFL season. On six occasions during his 10 years as an NFL assistant, his team earned a playoff berth: 2002, 2004, 2006, 2009, 2010 and 2011. And four of those trips came after division championships: The NFC South with Atlanta in 2004 and New Orleans in both 2006 and 2009, and the AFC West with Denver in 2011.

His résumé also includes football's ultimate prize, a Super Bowl XLIV ring he earned by helping the Saints beat season MVP Peyton Manning, who threw for more than 4,500 yards with 33 touchdowns, and the Indianapolis Colts to conclude the 2009 campaign.

The NFL's second-youngest defensive coordinator when the Broncos hired him in 2011, he coordinated a defense that helped Denver parlay an AFC West crown into a Wild Card win and a date in the Divisional round. During his only year in Denver, despite starting three rookies most of the season, the Broncos improved 12 spots over 2010 in overall defensive ranking (from 32nd to 20th) and bettered their points allowed by eight spots (from 32nd to 24th).

Prior to joining the Broncos, Allen was an assistant coach for five seasons with New Orleans, first as assistant defensive line coach (2006-07), then as defensive backs coach (2008-10).

Under Allen's direction in 2010, the Saints' secondary allowed an NFL-low 13 touchdown passes while ranking fourth in the NFL in net passing yards per game (193.9).

In 2009, Allen tutored a secondary that played a key role in helping the Saints to their first Super Bowl victory. His unit accounted for an NFL-high six interception returns for touchdowns and totaled 22 picks en route to their championship. One of his pupils, cornerback Tracy Porter, sealed the Saints' 31-17 win over Indianapolis by returning a Manning interception 74 yards for a touchdown late in the game.

He originally entered the NFL coaching ranks with Atlanta in 2002, spending four seasons with the Falcons as a defensive assistant. During his stint in Atlanta, the Falcons qualified for the playoffs twice—as a wild card in 2002 and as NFC South champs in 2004—and played in the NFC Championship in 2004.

Allen kicked off his football coaching career in 1996 as a graduate assistant at his alma mater, Texas A&M, where he was a four-year letterman as a safety. He worked with Aggies defensive backs for four seasons before coaching the secondary at the University of Tulsa from 2000-01.

A highly recruited defensive back at L. D. Bell High School in Hurst, Texas, before following his father, Grady Allen, to Texas A&M, Dennis went on to start the final 21 games of his career on the top-rated Texas A&M "Wrecking Crew" defense.

The Atlanta native was signed by Buffalo as an undrafted college free agent in 1996 and spent training camp with the Bills. His father, Grady, played in the NFL as a linebacker for the Atlanta Falcons from 1968-1972.

Allen and his wife, Alisson, have a son, Garrison, and a daughter, Layla.

Ranks sixth in Giants history in rushing yards, seventh in rushing attempts and ninth in rushing touchdowns. Has topped 1,000 rushing yards in a season on two occasions (2010 and 2012) and has rushed for over 100 yards in a game 12 times.

T-Gosder Cherilus: Started 71-of-74 games at right tackle for the Detroit Lions after being selected by the team in the first round (17th overall) of the 2008 NFL Draft. Last season, started all 16 games and helped pave the way for an offense that ranked second in the NFL in passing yards (4,927), third in overall net yards (6,540) and ninth in sacks allowed (29).

DT-Aubrayo Franklin: Has appeared in 126 games, making 79 starts over his 10-year NFL career. Holds regular season totals of 431 tackles (230 solo), eight passes defensed, 4.0 sacks, three forced fumbles, one fumble recovery and one interception.

Reggie Wayne has caught three-or-more passes in an NFL-record 64 consecutive games. He broke the previous record when he caught eight passes for 102 yards in Week 12 vs. Buffalo, which extended his streak to 59 straight games. Cris Carter held the previous record of 58 consecutive games as a member of the Minnesota Vikings from December 12, 1993 to October 5, 1997. Wayne's streak dates back to the first game of the 2009 season when he caught 10 passes for 162 yards vs. Jacksonville.

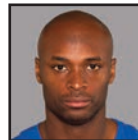

USE THE FORCE

Robert Mathis has totaled 91.5 career sacks in his 10-year career with the Colts, which ranks second in club history behind Dwight Freeney's 107.5. In 2005, he registered a sack in 11-of-13 games and set an NFL record with sacks in eight consecutive contests to start a season. Mathis has 20 multiple-sack games in his career and two three-plus sack games. He had a streak of three consecutive multiple-sack games in 2008 at San Diego (11/23), at Cleveland (11/30) and vs. Cincinnati (12/7). Dating back to his rookie season in 2003, Robert Mathis leads the Colts defense in forced fumbles with 38, topping his counterpart on the opposite end of the defensive line, Dwight Freeney who has 35. In 2011, both players combined for five forced fumbles as Indianapolis ranked tied for 10th in the NFL and tied for sixth in the AFC with 14.

SACK STREAK

Robert Mathis recorded a sack in eight consecutive games ending with the Colts' 2012 Week 9 contest against Miami, tying his personal best for his career. The streak dates back to the final three games of the 2011 season through the first five games he played in 2012. His previous eight-game sack streak came in the first eight games of the 2005 season. OLB-Dwight Freeney also had a nine-game sack streak from December 18, 2008 through November 8, 2009.

DOUBLE-DIGIT SACKS

FOUR SCORE

In Week 13 at Detroit, **Andrew Luck threw for a career-high four touchdowns, breaking the Colts single-game rookie record for most passing touchdowns.** The previous Colts record was three, which had been done seven times before. Peyton Manning was the last Colts rookie quarterback to throw for three touchdowns in a game, when he did so on four different occasions in 1998.

DOWN BUT NOT OUT

Down 21-3 at halftime of last year's Week 5 vs. Green Bay contest, Andrew Luck led his team to a 30-27 victory over the Packers. In doing so, **Luck became the first rookie quarterback to overcome an 18-plus point deficit to win a game since Matthew Stafford of the Detroit Lions did on November 22, 2009.**

During the NFL's expansion era since 1960, **only two other rookie quarterbacks have overcome such a deficit: John Elway (Broncos vs. Colts, 1983) and Vince Young (Titans vs. Giants, 2006).**

In Week 13 at Detroit, Luck threw a 14-yard touchdown pass to Donnie Avery on the final play to give the Colts a 35-33 victory over the Lions. Luck, who threw a game-winner to Reggie Wayne with 35 seconds remaining against the Packers in Week 5, **is the first NFL rookie to throw two game-winning touchdown passes inside the two-minute warning of the fourth quarter.**

Luck is also the fourth rookie since 1970 to throw a game-winning touchdown pass with no time left in the game. The other three quarterbacks to do that are Tim Couch (1999 Browns), Matthew Stafford (2009 Lions) and Russell Wilson (2012 Seattle Seahawks).
